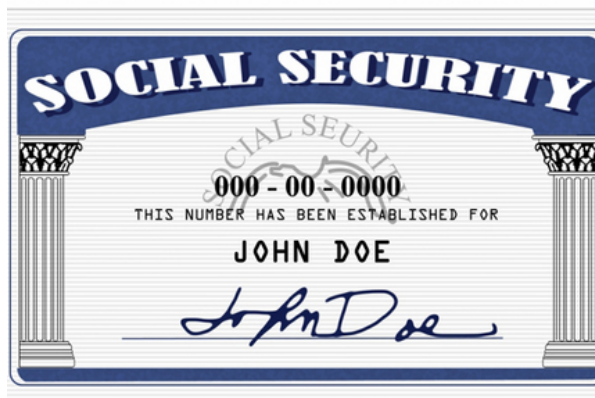

### **Type of Incident: Home Invasion**

On March 21<sup>st</sup> 2013 at 3:12pm, Pittsfield Township Police responded to the 4900 block of Ellsworth Road for a reported home invasion. The resident reported the front door had been kicked in and a 48 inch flat screen television, a 17 inch laptop computer, and a jar containing coins were stolen. The theft occurred sometime during the following dates March 19<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup> 2013.

### **Type of Incident: Larceny Of Copper Wire**

#### **Complaint # 13-3095**

On March 22<sup>nd</sup> 2013 at 8:52am, Pittsfield Township Police responded to the 4600 block of Runway Blvd. for a report of a larceny of copper electrical wiring. Management reported that they were missing 2,000 feet of electrical wire from their business. Value of the stolen wiring was \$14,326.34

### **Type of Incident: Larceny From A Motor Vehicle**

#### **Complaint # 13-3125**

On March 22<sup>nd</sup> 2013 at 7:05pm, Pittsfield Township Police responded to the 4800 block of Washtenaw Avenue for a reported larceny from a motor vehicle. The victim reported while she was in a local restaurant someone broke the passenger window of her 2008 Hyundai Veracruz and stole a laptop and GPS unit.
