WEEKLY FIRE REPORT

Total Calls for Service year to date: 1,918

The Pittsfield Township Fire Department was dispatched to the report of a rollover accident located at South Bound US 23 just South of Michigan Avenue. Firefighters arrived to find one patient trapped in-side of the vehicle and on patient laying in the median that was reported to have been ejected from the vehicle. By standers on-scene also reported that there was a third patient who was possibly trapped under the vehicle. Firefighters provided medical care to both patients and used the Jaws of Life to remove the trapped patient from the vehicle. Firefighters also used airbags and a wrecker from Brewers towing to lift the vehicle in-order to determine if there was a third patient trapped under the vehicle. A third patient was never located and no one was found to be trapped under the vehicle.

Both Patients suffered severe but non-life-threatening injuries. They were treated and transported to St. Joseph Mercy Hospital. The cause of the accident is unknown at this time and is under investigation by the Michigan State Police.

Armed Robbery # 2011-10269

On October 1, 2011 at approximately 7:55 pm, Pittsfield Township Police Officers were dispatched to the parking lot of the Chase Bank located at 6957 E. Michigan Ave. for a report of an armed robbery. The victim, a 22 year old male from York Township stated that as he was using the ATM a suspect wearing a black ski mask came up along the side of his vehicle and pointed a black semi-automatic handgun at him. The victim stated that the suspect demanded his money which he complied with. The suspect then fled east from the location. The victim was able to see that the suspect was a white male due to the eye holes in the mask. A K-9 was called and a track led to a nearby subdivision where it is believed the suspect got into a vehicle and fled. The suspect was described as a white male, 6'-1" tall wearing dark colored clothing.

Armed Robbery # 2011-10302

On October 2, 2011 at approximately 7:30 pm, Pittsfield Township Police Officers were dispatched to the parking lot of the Chase Bank located at 4101 Ellsworth Rd. for a report of an armed robbery. The victim, a 36 year old male resident from Lansing stated that as he was using the ATM a white male walked up along the side of his vehicle and pointed a silver semi-automatic handgun at him. The suspect, similar to the incident above demanded the victim's money which was turned over to him. The suspect then fled the scene east through the parking lot. The victim then observed a gold colored SUV fleeing out of the I-Hop restaurant located just east of the bank and was able to recognize the driver as the suspect that just robbed him. The victim then attempted to follow the suspect west on Ellsworth Rd. but lost sight of him in the area of Platt Rd. The suspect was described as a white male, mid 20's, tall and slender build, blond wavy hair, clean shaven, last seen wearing a blue sweatshirt.

The Pittsfield Township Police Department is asking everyone to be aware of their surroundings when using an ATM and to report any suspicious people immediately to the police.
