COMMUNITY EVENTS – INFORMATION

Emergency Services Division – Outdoor Warning Sirens Test “March – September 2014”

Saturday March 1, 2014 at 12:00 noon

Washtenaw County’s 68 warning sirens will be tested at Noon on the First Saturday of every month from March through September. If there is a threat of severe weather on the day of the test it will be cancelled.

Except for scheduled testing, the sirens will be activated for the following emergencies:

- The National Weather Service has issued a tornado warning.
- A severe thunderstorm has been detected with damaging winds in excess of 70 mph.
- A hazardous material's accident requires immediate protective action by the public.
- An attack on the United States is imminent, underway or has recently occurred.

Warning siren activation is a signal to members of the public to immediately go indoors and monitor local Emergency Alert System media outlets for official information. Washtenaw County’s emergency broadcasters are:

Type of Incident: Assault with Intent to Murder – Assault with a Dangerous Weapon-Felony Firearm

Information: On February 18, 2014, at 7:23am Officers responded to the 1400 block of Oak Valley Drive for a report of a subject who had fired a handgun at a person plowing snow in the Valley Ranch Apartments. Upon arrival officers located the suspect and took him into custody without incident. The incident began as a result of snow being moved in front of the suspect's personal vehicle and the vehicle not being able to be moved as a result. The windshield of the front-end loader was struck by the bullet causing damage though the victim did not sustain any injuries. The suspect has been transported to the Washtenaw County Jail pending review of the case by the Washtenaw County Prosecutor's Office.

Update: On February 19, 2014, the Washtenaw County Prosecutor's Office authorized the following charges against the defendant; Assault with Intent to Murder (Felony, up to life), Assault with a Dangerous Weapon (Felony, up to 4 years), Weapons – Felony Firearms (Felony, 2 years). Bond was set at \$45,000 cash.

Type of Incident: Attempted Home Invasion
