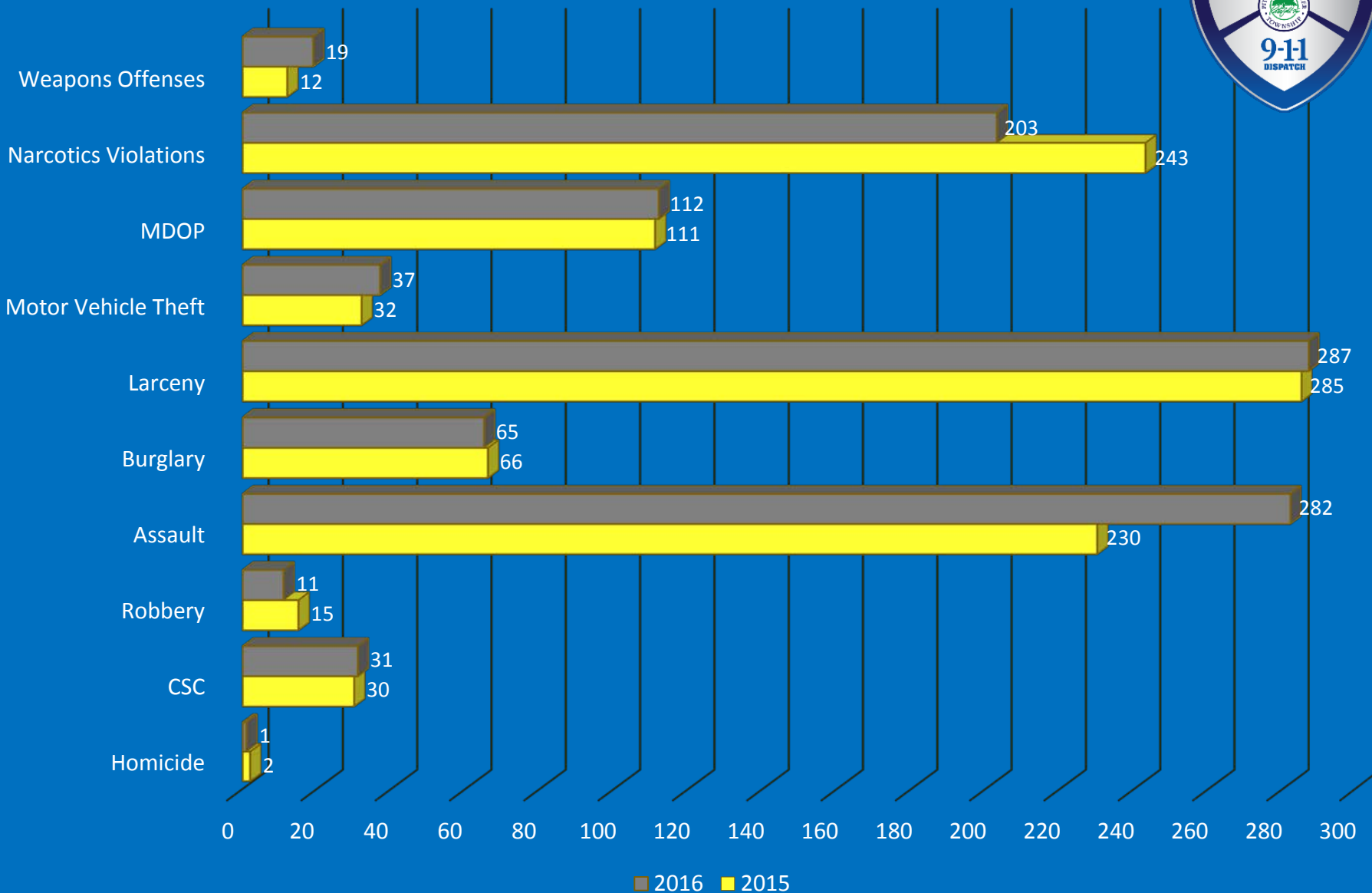

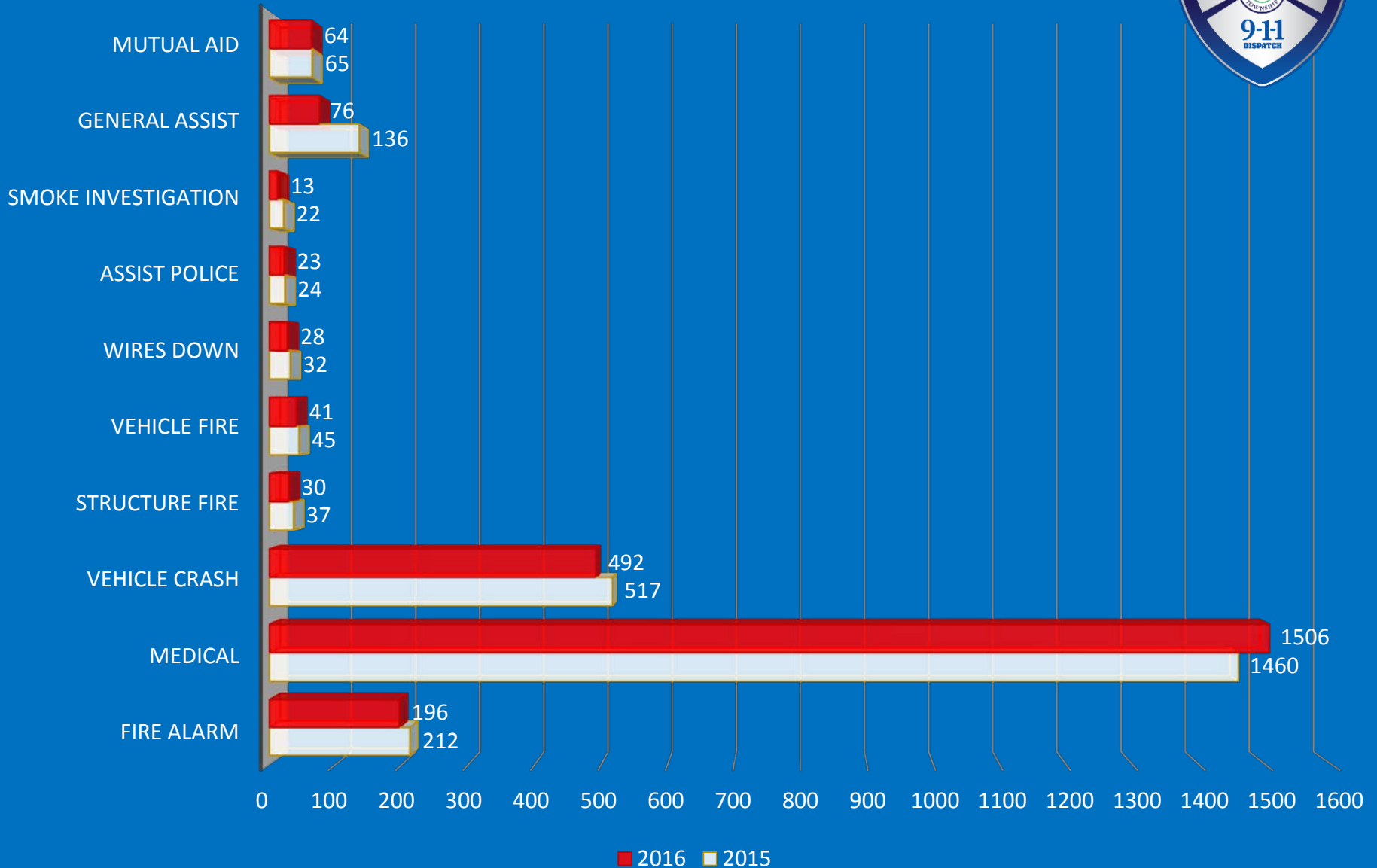

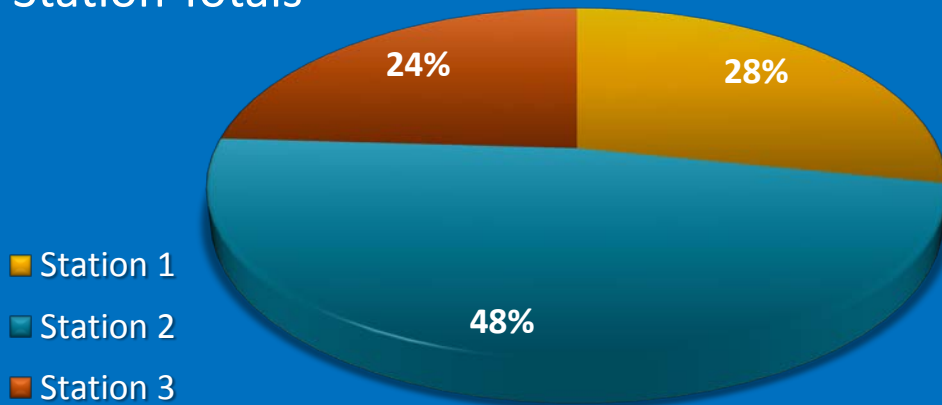

Public Security Camera System



On August 14, 2013, the Board of Trustees approved the purchase of six public security cameras, and on November 11, 2013, the Policy which governs the acceptable use of this surveillance system was approved. Therefore, Pittsfield Township has six public locations with cameras installed. Aside from testing/training, the data was accessed in 2016 for the following:

- Felonious Assault / MDOP private property (June) – no suspect identified
- Larceny from Auto (November) – no suspect identified



2016 False Alarm Appeals



The Pittsfield Township Department of Public Safety regularly responds to alarms that are deemed to be false. On occasion, individuals or businesses, who have incurred fees as a result of these false alarms, ask that their fees be waived because they feel they are not culpable. In 2016, there were ZERO False Alarm Appeals.

MACP Accreditation
